NCATA TAKING STEPS TO TREAT BUSES

The health, safety and well-being of our passengers, employees, and the communities we serve, is of the most importance.

NCATA has taken a step to reduce the spread of germs to their customers and employees on their buses and at their facilities as they continue to provide bus service in the face of the coronavirus pandemic.

The product that NCATA has selected is Aegis Microbe Shield. Used in the public transportation industry for more than 2 years, the product is not a disinfectant. Instead, it uses nanotechnology to physically destroy microbes deposited by touch or through the air. All hard and soft surfaces on NCATA buses are being treated including seats, grab bars, doors, and windows. To help keep employees safe, common areas at NCATA facilities are also being treated.
